ANSWERS FOR DISCOURAGEMENT

THE STING OF DISCOURAGEMENT

- All of us face it at some point varying degrees
 - 1. Because of a negative situation where you don't see an end
 - 2. An unexpected event that caught you by surprise
 - 3. Dealing with life, believing no one understands or sees or cares
- As believers, we have options available to us (John 14:1 CSB)
 - 1. We believe in a God who can shine light onto our situation
 - 2. We believe in Jesus who understands the human condition
 - 3. We believe Christianity is not a philosophy or religious structure for life

WHEN JOHN THE BAPTIST WAS DISCOURAGED (Matthew 11:2-6 CSB)

- John was in a dark place literally
 - 1. Prison impacted him negatively
 - 2. He was questioning whether or not Jesus was the Messiah
 - 3. He was offended that Jesus had not gotten him out of prison
- But John knew better (John 1:29-34 CSB)
 - 1. He had a revelation of who Jesus was
 - 2. John's ministry was to prepare Israel for Jesus
 - 3. John got off his mission telling the king who he was to marry was not his calling
- Jesus answered John
 - 1. In recounting the miracles, he reminded John of the prophetic scriptures about the Messiah
 - 2. Jesus reminded John that the blessed ones were not offended by Jesus

YOU HAVE ANSWERS FOR DISCOURAGEMENT

- · You are not in this alone
 - 1. Believing you are isolated and no one sees / cares makes things worse
 - 2. Believe that you are loved and cared for (Galatians 2:20 CSB)
 - 3. The church can play a role in helping you see you are in God's family
- Let the Lord speak to you
 - 1. He speaks by His Holy Spirit
 - 2. The primary way He will speak is through His word
 - 3. When you are in the darkness of discouragement, you need light (*Psalms 119:49-50 CSB*)
- Don't get offended at Jesus
 - 1. Whatever discouragement you are facing is not His fault
 - 2. Stay connected to the One who loves you, cares for you, and can give you strength
 - 3. Not every situation in life will get fixed exactly as you want it (Philippians 4:12-13 CSB)
